The centrally located Liege Port therefore has each and every West European region within its catchment area.


More than 60% of the European purchasing power and 56 million of consumers can be reached from Liege Port Authority.

The largest inland port in Belgium and the third leading one in Europe, Liege Port Authority is based in a dynamic economic region.

Ideally situated at the hub of a closely linked network of multimodal communications (waterway-rail-road), Liege Port Authority is a major logistical platform.

A unique geographical location in Europe!

Access by road:

Liege Port Authority is at the hub of a huge road network, located at the crossroads of 6 motorways, fast connections to Antwerp, Brussels, the Netherlands, Luxembourg, Germany and France.

Access by sea and inland waterway:

- Liege Port Authority has a direct link with the major European sea ports of North-West Europe
- Accessible to coasters (sea-going vessels up to 2,500t)
- Accessible to convoys propelled by two barges (4,500t)

Access by rail:

At the crossroads of 4 lines forming part of the European railway network, Liege Port Authority acts as a hub for freight traffic in Belgium.

Access by air:

The adjacency of *Liege Airport*, the 8th leading European airport for freight traffic, adds something more to Liege Port Authority's unique qualities.

Liege Port Authority is currently developing "Liege Trilogiport" multimodal platform. Located along the Albert canal, in Hermalle-sous-Argenteau, this future multimodal platform is set to become a fully-fledged "logistical village" in the heart of Europe in due course.

A container terminal (15 ha)

Located along the Albert canal, the container terminal will be earmarked for vessel loading and unloading activities. The stored containers are to be transferred to trucks, goods wagons or barges heading for various destinations in Europe, or deposited in the logistical stores available in European distribution centres to be processed and then reshipped.

A logistics area (60 ha)

Liege Trilogiport will house a logistical area, located at the rear of the container terminal, serving European distributions centres.

Companies will use this area to provide added value to goods transported in containers. These state-of-the art logistical halls will be where the goods are stored, processed, repacked and reorganised before being sent to various European destinations by waterway, rail or road.

A tertiary services area (1 ha)

This area will accommodate the specific tertiary services (offices, customers...) required for the platform's economic development.

An environmental integration area (40 ha)

Special attention has been paid to the way the landscape and the environmental integration area is designed. Keen to ensure the wellbeing of all citizens Liege Port Authority and the Wallonia Public Service are committed to earmarking over 39 ha for this area: one-quarter of the Liege Trilogiport's total surface area. The area will feature green spaces, community gardens and areas for walking...
